President Clinton met at the United Nations with President Lennart Meri of Estonia, President Algirdas Brazauskas of Lithuania and President Guntis Ulmanis of Latvia. It was the President's first meeting with the heads of state of the Baltic countries.

The President expressed his admiration for the remarkable progress the Baltic peoples have achieved during the last two years in establishing democratic institutions and promoting economic reform. The President assured them of the strong U.S. interest in building close relations. The President reaffirmed U.S. support for reform and indicated the U.S. would move forward promptly on the new

\$50 million Baltic-American Enterprise fund.

The President welcomed the recent withdrawal of all Russian military forces from Lithuania. He also reiterated strong U.S. support for the early, unconditional and rapid withdrawal of the remaining Russian forces from Latvia and Estonia. The President noted that he had raised this matter in a number of recent discussions with Russian Federation leaders. The

United States intends to be helpful to all parties concerned in promoting an amicable resolution of the withdrawal issue.

The President also discussed concerns raised by the Russian government about the treatment of Ethnic Russians in Latvia and Estonia while noting that international observers had found no evidence of human rights violations in those countries. The President expressed the hope that practical solutions could be achieved on this difficult issue. In this regard, the U.S. welcomes the constructive role played by the United Nations, the Conference on Security and Cooperation in Europe (CSCE) and The Council of Europe (COE) in helping to promote a resolution of all outstanding differences between Russia and the Baltic countries.

While in America, the three Baltic presidents had an opportunity to meet with their countrymen in the U.S.

The American Baltic News noted the most interesting meetings were those open to the general public.

In spite of the fact that a Lithuanian-language New York Weekly published an editorial recommending boycotting of the scheduled meeting of the Lithuanian community, the attendance was around 300, filling up the hall at New York's Lithuanian Cultural Center.

ABN reports Mr. Brazauskas gave a brief presentation and then fielded questions from the audience. The session lasted nearly two hours with Brazauskas answering questions on privatization, censorship of the press, citizenship issues, the mafia, crime, etc.

Due to the large number of questioners, they were asked to kindly state their questions and refrain from making long

statements.

Some of the questions came from people who had visited Lithuania and who had encountered specific events while on their visit.

In reply to the questions President Brazauskas answered; no, there is no press censorship by the state government. Privatization is a difficult question, as it means the eviction of thousands from their homes - and the government does not have the resources to relocate that many people. Yes, the government recognizes the criminal element and is working to control it.

Overall, President Brazauskas handled the questions well. It showed him to be a well-informed individual, in command of an American-style public meeting such as this. His answers also projected a conciliatory tone towards American Lithuanians. Yet one could not but feel sadness that the meeting ever took place. A meeting

Listed here are some of the services offered seniors residing in Pennsylvania provided to us from the offices of Senator Charles D. Lemmond, Jr. 20th District, PA.

STATE INCOME TAX EXEMPTIONS

If you are retired; you do not have to pay state income taxes on Social Security payments, railroad retirement, any pension benefits (including veterans benefits), or Supplemental Security Income.

REDUCED DENTAL RATES

If you are 65 years of age or older, and have an annual income under \$13,000 for single persons, \$16,200 for married couples,

* and do not have any federal, state or other dental health assistance or private dental insurance;

reduced dental rates of at least 15% under the Pennsylvania Dental Association's "Access to Care Program." For more information call: 1-800-692-7256.

STATE MUSEUMS AND HISTORICAL SITES

If you are:

* 65 years of age or older; you may be eligible for reduced admission to Pennsylvania State Historical and Museum Commission sites, properties and museums.

MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATION

If you are:

* retired and have a total income from all sources not exceeding \$14,999;

you may be eligible for a reduced registration fee of \$10 on any vehicle not weighing more than 9,000 lbs.

Turkey and all the Trimmings

Cooking your Thanksgiving meal can be an enjoyable project if planned properly. A very important thing to remember is to plan your cooking time to have the turkey done at least 1/2 hour before the scheduled time to eat.

Most all thanksgiving turkeys come with a schedule of thawing and roasting time on the wrapper. Follow these directions carefully. The temperature suggested is usually 325 degrees and the roasting time for a stuffed bird is about 1/2 hour more than for an unstuffed one. A shallow open pan also requires 1/2 hour more roasting time than a covered enamel roaster.

An 8 to 12 pound stuffed bird roasted at 325° in a shallow open pan should take about 3 1/2 to 4 hours. So if dinner is scheduled for 6 p.m., that turkey should be in the oven around 1:30 p.m.

Give yourself plenty of time to prepare the turkey. Once it has been properly thawed, rinse it under running water and dry it with a cloth.

Stuffing is never done in advance. Wait until right before roasting. Lightly spoon in the stuffing and bake the remainder in a casserole.

Use pins or skewers to hold the skin together when closing the cavity. You can sew up the opening with an old-fashioned needle and thread method or lace the opening closed with crisscrossed string. Tie the ends of the drumsticks together so that the legs will be close to the body. Turn the wings back behind the shoulders and fasten a piece of string around the skin of the neck or sew it down if preferred.

Place the bird breast side up on a rack in the particular pan you have chosen to use and rub the skin with a bit of oil. If using a shallow open roasting pan, cover the turkey lightly with aluminum foil. During the last 45 minutes of roasting time,

take off the foil and cut the string binding the legs.

If you have a meat thermometer, insert it in the center of the inside thigh muscle being careful not to touch the bone. The turkey is done when the thermometer registers between 185 and 190 degrees.

If you don't have a meat thermometer, about 20 minutes before you feel the turkey should be done, prick the skin of the thigh and if the juice is no longer pinkish in color, the bird is done. You should also be able to move the drumstick up and down and freely twist it in its socket.

When done, remove the turkey from the oven and let stand 30 minutes before slicing and serving.

TURKEY GRAVY

Fat
Drippings
Milk
1/2 cup flour
1 tsp. salt
1/8 tsp. pepper

Pour drippings from roasting pan into large liquid measure. Spoon 4 tablespoons fat from top of drippings and return them to the roasting pan. Spoon any remaining fat from drippings. To the drippings add enough milk to make 4 cupfuls. Blend flour into fat in roasting pan and stir and heat to brown. Gradually add liquid, stirring to blend. Stir and heat to make a smooth gravy. Add finely chopped giblets, if desired. Season with salt and pepper. Bring to a boil. Stir and cook 5 to 10 minutes.

OLD FASHIONED BREAD STUFFING

Yield: 8 cups (enough for 12 pound turkey)

1 and 1/2 cups finely chopped onion

1 and 1/2 cups finely chopped celery

1 stick (1/2 cup) butter or margarine

1 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon poultry seasoning

1/2 teaspoon sage

Pepper

8 cups dry unseasoned bread cubes

1/4 cup water or broth

Cook onion and celery in butter until tender. Mix seasonings together and sprinkle over bread cubes. Add onion mixture and water. Combine. Stuff turkey and roast immediately.

PUMPKIN PIE


1 nine-inch unbaked pie shell
1 and 2/3 cups cooked pumpkin
2/3 cup sugar
1/2 tsp. salt
1/2 tsp. cinnamon
1/4 tsp. nutmeg
1/4 tsp. cloves
1/4 tsp. ginger
2 tblsp. molasses
2 eggs
1 and 2/3 cups milk

Chill pie shell. Combine ingredients in order given and beat with rotary beater until blended. Pour into chilled pie shell and bake in a 400 degree oven for 50 minutes.

FRESH BROCCOLI AND CARROTS

Scrape or peel carrots and slice. Cut broccoli into florets.

Place sliced carrots in collapsible steaming basket and put steamer in medium sized saucepan of rapidly boiling wa-



ter. Lower heat and simmer for about 20 minutes. Add broccoli florets and steam about 5 minutes longer.

Remove steamer from pot and put in serving dish. Add salt, pepper and butter or for those watching their fat content, flavor with lemon juice.

CANDIED SWEET POTATOES OR YAMS

6 medium sized yams
1/2 tsp. cinnamon
1/2 tsp. nutmeg
1/2 tsp. ginger
4 tblsp. butter
1/3 cup sugar
Juice 1 lemon

Peel and slice the sweet potatoes or yams. Put half in a heavy flat saucepan; sprinkle over half the spices. Add half the butter and half the sugar. Then put on a second layer of the yams, spices, butter, and sugar. Add the lemon juice. Cover with cold water. Put on a lid and simmer very slowly, basting frequently. Cook until tender, about 35 minutes; then brown in the oven or under the broiler.

Clyde Helton of KSPR in Springfield, MO, said the show was "**more graphic**" than he would have liked. "I don't think it will play well in Springfield." Perry Chester of WQAD in Moline, IL, called the sex scene "a little strong."

Bochco told USA Today: "**TV has always been 30 years behind the times.** It's no secret I've been trying to drag these folks kicking and screaming into the 1990s. And I must say, **ABC...has been terrific.**" He told ABC's Good Morning, America: "I would hope...that networks will begin to allow those of us who are making serious dramas to bring, to produce more explicit material for network television...Language, sex, the whole panoply."

St. Casimir's Celebrates Centennial

On October 3, 1993, St. Casimir's Church of Philadelphia marked 100 years of service to the community. An anniversary Mass was offered with Anthony Cardinal Bevilacqua as principal celebrant.

Following Mass, a dinner-dance was held at Penn's Landing Caterers in Philadelphia.

Before acquiring their own church, the Lithuanian people of Philadelphia attended Mass at various churches in the area.

Starting with 60 Lithuanian families in 1893, the late Rev. Joseph J. Kaulakis saw that number increase to 1,000 families by 1918.

After celebrating Mass in various churches in the Diocese, a Protestant Church was purchased in 1894 but it soon became too small for the ever increasing number of parishioners and a larger building (the current location) was purchased.

The first Mass was offered on July 2, 1905 and the church was named St. Casimir.

The present pastor of St. Casimir Parish is Rev. Eugene Wassel and although the parishioners are smaller in number, it is still a Lithuanian parish.

The letter notes Lithuanians are still experiencing inflation.

Farmers are suffering since the government doesn't buy their grain and vegetables and if the government does, the farmer

isn't paid for a long period of time.

Heating costs have increased 3 times, food prices are higher than in the West and salaries are 10 to 15 times lower.

Vicki and Norbert were told the Pope's visit was "a great holiday for our worn out souls," and "an event too difficult to describe." People who were formerly at odds with each other seemed friendlier.



-- **Vitas Lingys**, 33 metų žymus Lietuvos žurnalistas, spalio 12 d. buvo nušautas netoli savo namų. Lingys buvo įkūrėjas ir leidėjas vieno populiariausiu Lietuvos dienraščiu "Respublika". Paskutiniai žurnalistu straipsniai buvo apie organizuotą nusikalstamumą ir mafiją. Pranešama, kad Lingui buvo ne kartą grasinama mirtimi.

-- **Lietuvos Seimo** Tėvynės Santara nuo spalio 12 d. atidare nemokamą konsultacinių punkta, kuris konsultuoja nuosavybės teisių į žemę ir kitą nekilnojamą turą atstatymo ir gynimo klausimais. Punktas veikia Vilniuje, Jakšto g. 9, 301 kabinete, antradieniais ir penktadieniais nuo 10 iki 14 val. Telefonas pasiteirauti - 22 73 87.

-- **Šeštasis tarptautinis džiazo** festivalis spalio 8 d. prasidėjo Vilniuje. Ryškiausia festivalio žvaigždė - 1987 m. iš Lietuvos į Izraelį emigravęs muzikantas ir kompozitorius Viačeslavas Ganinas.

-- **Apie 80% kuro** rezervuaru jau pripildyta Lietuvoje. Vidutiniškai kiekviena mazuto tona kaina va po \$45. Prognozuojama, kad šiemet mazuto kaina gali išaugti iki \$70-\$75 už toną. "Lietuvos kuro" bazėse jau dabar sukauptu

akmens anglų turėtų pakakti mažiausiai iki kitų metų pradžios.

-- **Policijos darbuotojų** dieina spalio 1 d. pažymėta Šiaulių kapinėse prie kriminalinės policijos valdininko Juozo Smulkevičiaus, kuris dirbo Šiauliuse ir 1938 m. eidamas tarnybines pareigas žuvo, kapo. Būrys jaunuų policijos darbuotojų davė priesaiką.

-- **Dar 7 personalines** pensijas paskyrė Lietuvos vyriausybė: skulptoriui P. P. Aleksandravičiui, rašytojui J. Avyžiui, žemės ūkio mokslininkui ir Seimo nariui A. Būdvyčiui, sporto veteranui S. Butautui, kultūros veikėjai E. Dirsenei, gydytojui V. Kleizai bei A. M. Pladytei, nukentėjusiai per 1991 m. sausio agresiją. Personalinės pensijos iki šiol paskirtos 54 asmenims. Dabar ši pensija yra 166 litai ir 84 centai per mėnesį.

-- **Lietuvos** tautininkų sąjunga išplatino pareiškimą, kuriame reikalaujama, kad LDDP turi pasitraukti, nes tik tuomet bus įmanoma igyvendinti idealą, kur būtų saugus ir laisvas žmogus, saugi ir demokratiška valstybė.

-- **Lenkijoje** prie Lietuvos ambasados pradėjo veikti Generalinis konsulatas.

-- **Lietuvos prezidentas** A.

Brazauskas gavo NATO generalinio sekretoriaus Manfred Woerner laišką, kuriame reiškiamas noras gilinti NATO ir Lietuvos ryšius ir tikimasi tolesnio aktyvaus dalyvavimo NATO Parlamentinės asamblejos darbe. M. Woerner pakvietė A. Brazauską apsilankytį NATO būstineje su oficialiu vizitu kitų metų pradžioje.

-- **Lietuvos kariuomenės** vadu Lietuvos Prezidentas pasiūlė 49 metų Krašto apsaugos mokyklos viršininką Joną Andriškevičių. Nuo 1966 m. Andriškevičius buvo Sovietų Sąjungos komunistų partijos narys. Iš partijos išstojo 1990 m. Nuo 1984 m. spalio iki 1991 m. spalio mén. pulkininkas buvo Vilniaus universiteto karinės katedros viršininku.

-- **Lietuvos ir Islandijos** bendra įmonė "Proguna" pradėjo veikti Klaipėdoje. Joje bus gaminti nedidelių gyvenamųjų namų elementai ir iš jų bus montuojami modernūs vienaaukščiai ir dviaukšciai kotedžai. Manoma, kad namai bus populiarūs ne tik Skandinavijoje ir kitose Europos šalyse, bet ir Lietuvoje, nes jie bus patogūs, jaukūs, šilti ir kainuos ne brangiau už lietuviškus.

-- **31 Kinijos kompanija** ir 4 kinų restoranai jau atvėrė savo duris Lietuvoje. Šiemet Lietuva iš Kinijos jau importavo \$223,000

vertės grūdų, \$133,000 vertės tabako, \$56,000 vertės arbatžolių ir prieskoniu. Tai pat Lietuva iš Kinijos išsivežė metalo dirbinių, tekstilių, keramikos dirbinių, avalynės.

-- **Trečiasis tarptautinis** popmuzikos festivalis "Vilnius-93" vyko Vilniuje spalio 8-10 d. Konkurso programoje dalyvavo atlikėjai iš 15 šalių, pirmą kartą festivalyje skambėjo gyva muzika.

-- **Šiaulių miesto** valdyba Dainų mikrorajone išnuomojo žemės sklypą Naujosios apaštalų bažnyčios bendruomenės nariams, kurių mieste beveik 400. Tokios bažnyčios jau statomos Vilniuje ir Šilutėje, gauti leidimai statyti Kretingos rajone ir Klaipėdoje.

-- **Laikinasis Lietuvos banko** valdytojas J. Sinkevičius, pakiečis R. Visokavičių, pareiškė, kad bankas ir toliau vadovaus vadinamu reguliuojamu kintamu valiutos kursu lito atžvilgiu. Jis mano, kad bankui pavyks išlaikyti lito ir dolerio santykį nuo 4,1:1 iki 4,3:1. Sinkevičius paskelbė, kad popieriniai 1,2 ir 5 litų banknotai pasirodys kiek vėliau negu buvo žadėta (ne spalio pradžioje). Laikinasis Lietuvos banko valdytojas yra profesionalus teisininkas.

-- **Istatymo projektas** dėl gyventojų santaupų kompensavimo ir akcijų vertės atstatymo bus artimiausiu metu svarstomas Seime. Rugpjūto 30 d. posėdyje projekta pateikė G. Vagnorius. Seimas 81 balsu pateikimui pritarė.

LIETUVOS AUKŠTOJO PILOTAŽO MEISTRAS

— Jurgis Kairys pakeliui į pasaulio taurės laimėtojus —

Pasaulinės aukštojo pilotažo varžybos tebevyksta ir baigsis šiemet Miami Beach, Floridoje, lapkričio mėnesį. Tarp kandidatų iš viso pasaulio dalyvauja ir Lietuvos nepaprastas aukštojo pilotažo meistras Jurgis Kairys, kuris šios rūšies sporto pasaulyje dabar žinomas taip gerai, kaip krepšinio Sabonis ar Marčiulionis.

Vilniuje, minint Dariaus ir Gireno skrydžio per Atlantą šeštadegimtmetį, už 20 km esančiame Kyviškių aviacijos poligone liepos 18 d. įvykusios šventės pадangėje pasirodė ir Jurgis Kairys. Jis čia savo akrobatinius skraidymus išdarinėjo lėktuvu SU-26, kurį nusipirkė drauge su bendražygį Vytautu Lapėnu, pasiryžęs dėti pamatus Lietuvos akrobatinio skraidymo tarptautinei mokyklai.

Savaime suprantama, kad Kairys ir buvo didžiausia atrakcija, nors publikos nebuvo tiek daug, kiek susirenka jos užsieniuose, kur jo valdomas lėktuvas "danguje šoka, maudosi, eina kūlverščia, krenta žemyn lyg pašautas paukšteliis ir vėl gręžiasi į dangų", kaip sako viena Lietuvos sporto žurnalistė. Rudenį, kai pasibaigs didysis pasaulio taurės varžybos sezona, jis ketina dar sykį pasirodyti Lietuvoje.

Jis atskris naujausiui Suchojaus firmos lėktuvu SU-31, kuriuo jis dalyvauja varžybose ir kuris tokios modifikacijos yra vienintelis pasaulyje. Net Rusijos rinktinė tokio lėktuvo neturi, o Kairys juo skraido ir Lietuvai laurus skina.

Iš kur tokia privilegija? Pasirodo, Kairys yra tos Rusijos bendrovės lėkūnas-bandytojas. Jisai nuo 1984 metų dalyvauja lėktuvų konstrukcijoje. Inžinieriai atsižvelgė į jo aukštojo pilotažo supratimą ir į tai, koks, jo manymu, turėtų būti akrobatinis lėktuvas. Jis kainuoja apie 200 tūkstančių dol. Tačiau galutinė kaina bus nustatyta po visų bandymų.

Firma jo bandymais patenkinta ir nepriestarauja, kad jis varžybose dalyvauja Lietuvos

vardu. Mat firmai reikalingas tokis bandytojas-lėkūnas, o Kairiui reikalinga firma, nes be toko lėktuvo pasaulinėse varžybose pirmauti būtų sunkiau. Todėl Kairys Maskvoje praleidžia didžiumą savo laiko, Vilniuje gyvenančią žmoną Birutę su vienuolikmečiu Mantu ir ketverių metukų Simu aplankydamas retkarčiais.

Kairys labai susirūpinęs, kad Lietuvos jaunimas labiau susidomėtų aukštuoju pilotažu. Jis viliasi, kad ateinančiais metais pasaulio aukštojo pilotažo čempionate Vengrijoje dalyvaus jau ne vienas, nes Lietuva turi gerų

lakūnų.

Aukštojo pilotažo pagrindiniai vertinimo kriterijai yra: programos įvairumas, originalumas, harmonija, ritmas, atlikimo kokybė, tikslumas ir dar kartą tikslumas. Kairys pabrėžia, kad skraidymo meistru nereikia gimi-
ti, bet šio to įgimto reikia turėti. Tačiau daugiausia meistrišku-
mas pasiekiamas darbu, atsidejimu, užsidegimu.

Kairjaviacijai paskatino "ku-
kurūzninkai". Šilalės rajono Ber-
žės kaimo laukuose jie barstė
trąšas. Jis lėkūnams talkino
žemėje, o tie kaimo vaikų pa-
vežiodavo dangumi.

Baigės vidurinę, išvyko laikyt
egzaminus į lėkūnų mokyklą Vil-
niuje. Deja, medicinos komisija
rado "ligą", bet tikrovėje kalta
buvo jo biografija — mat buvo
gimęs Krasnojarsko krašte, kur
augo aštuonerius metus, jo tėvus

ten ištrėmė 1950 m. Tad Vybor-
go aviacijos technikos mokykloje
studijavo trejus metus ir ją
baigės sugrįžo į Lietuvą. Di-
džiausiam džiaugsmui, Kauno
sporto klubas ji priėmė nariu.
Nuo tada viskas ir prasidėjo,
nors darbo reikėjo daug.

Ar pakilęs į pasaulines aukštu-
mas, žemiškais dalykais domisi?
Dar ir kaip! Sugrįžęs į Vilnių, J.
Kairys visada džiaugiasi naujais
dalykais, kad žmonės vaduoja
iš pasyvumo, ir pasakojo, būtų
tragedija, jei Lietuva sugrįžtų
ten, kur buvo.

ĮŽIEBTA VILTIS, NURODYTAS KELIAS

"... lietuviai sugebės kurti gėjį, vieningai ir taikiai gyventi." — Jonas Paulius II

Simoliška, kad Popiežius Jonas Paulius II pradėjo ir baigė savo kelionę būtent Vilniuje - Lietuvos sostinėje. Čia visa Lietuva pirmą kartą išvydo Popiežių, bučiuojantį Lietuvos žemę, išgirdo pirmuosius Šv. Tėvo žodžius ir čia buvo pirmasis palaiminimas. Dar ilgai bus išiklausoma į Popiežiaus pasakyti žodžius, prisimenama kiekviena viešnagės akimirka, apmaštomas kiekvienas sakiny. Kiek daug nuveikta, kiek pasakyta kalbų. Prasminga prisiminti Šv. Tėvo žodžius kiekviename gyvenimo žingsnyje, sunkiame ar laiminome. Popiežiaus šypsenai ir minys tapo kelrodžiu Lietuvai jos sunkiame kelyje.

Prisiminkime pirmą vizito dieną - rugsejo 4-ąją, kai Popiežius aerouoste taré savo pirmąjį sveikinimo žodį Lietuvai. Šv. Tėvo lúpomis lietuviškai liejosi meilė ir pagarba Lietuvai ir jos žmonėms:

"Nepaprastai jaudindamasis ką tik pabučiavau Lietuvos žemę, dėkojau Dievui už man duotą malonę atvykti pas jus.

Trokšte troškau aplankytu ypač man brangią jūsų žemę! Vos tik neįžvelgiama Dievo valia buvau išrinktas į Apašalo Petro sostą,

nuskubėjau į Gailestingumo Motinos lietuvių koplyčią Vatikano Bazilikos požemyje. Ten, prie Mergelės Marijos kojų, meldžiausi už jus visus.

Ši jūsų žemė yra brangi visai krikščioniškajai tautai, pasklidusiai penkuose žemynuose! Lietuva - tyli liudininkė karstos meilės religijos laisvei, kuri, ne kartą pabrėžiau, yra visų kitų žmogiškų ir visuomeninių laisvių pagrindas. Lietuva visad stengési paliudyti savo ištikimybę Katalikų Bažnyčiai, nuėjo ilgą, skausmingą kelią į laisvę ir išgarsėjo kaip kankinių ir išpažinėjų žemė".

Šv. Tėvas savo pirmoje kalboje surado vietos ir karvedžiui Mindaugui, Vytautui Didžiajam, Šventajam Kazimierui. Kalbos pabaigoje Jonas Paulius II tare:

"Atkeliauju pas jus pirmiausia kaip Ganytojas, tad trokštu padrašinti toliau kurti naują Lietuvą, štai jau laisvą ir siekiančią kuo geriau išvystyti savo galimybes".

Iš aerouosto Šv. Tėvas patraukė tiesiai į Lietuvos širdį - Šventovę - Vilniaus Arkikatedrą. Čia jau Popiežius sakė ilgą kalbą Lietuvos kunigams, vienuoliams, vienuolėms ir klerikams. Jis išryškino

šiandieninį kunigo pašaukimą:

"Kaip Gerasis ganytojas priimkite ir eikite pasitiki kiekvieno žmogaus. Visi, ypač jaunimas, ieško "dvasios tévų", gerų vadovų ir Evangelijos dvasiai gyvenančių mokytojų. Išklausykite, padrašinkite, palaikykite ir vadovaukite Dievo tautai, žengiančiai tiesos ir šventumo takais. Štai kur jūsų pasiuntinybė, akivaizdžiai reiklaujanti, kad be atvango stengtumės būti ištikimi ir mylēti Kristu, žmonijos gelbėtoją. Prieš akis visa turėkite Jėzaus pavyzdį, su dieviškuoju Mokyoju kasdien kalbė-

kitės, jo klausykite ir ištikimai sekite, kad taptumėte jo atsiustos Šventosios Dvasio įnagiais".

Šv. Tėvas nurodė ir naujo žmogaus bruožų kūrimo būtinybę ir metodus:

"Po kiekvieno reikšmingo visuomeninio pasikeitimo žmogaus elgesys ir siela būna žaizdota. Tokiai laikotarpiais itin svarbu, kad Dievui pasižventusieji žmonės parodytų gyvą teologinių ir bendražmogiškų savybių sąsają, kuri pagimdo naują, vidinių prieštaramų neturinčią žmoniją. Sąžiningumas, garbingumas, darbštumas, tvarkingumas, pasitikėjimas

tarnavimo dvasia, nuoširdumas, pagarba, santūra, kilniadvasišumas, teisingumo ir atsakomybės jausmas, dvasinė pusiausvyra, romumas, atvirumas, - štai kai kurie "naujojo žmogaus" bruožai".

Atvykimo dienos vakare Šv. Tėvas meldėsi Aušros Vartų koplyčioje. Čia prie atnaujinto ir restauruoto Šv. Mergelės Marijos paveikslėlio Jonas Paulius II kalbėjo Šv. Rožinį. Po maldos Popiežius suteikė susirinkusiems apaštališkajai palaiminimai ir lietuvių, lenkų, baltarusių kalbomis kreipėsi į tikinčiuosius. Popiežiui paliekant Aušros vartų koplyčią, skambėjo giesmė "Marija, Marija".

Rugsėjo 5-oji, antroji Popiežiaus diena Vilniuje. Po kasdienio atidauš ir rüpestingo susitelkimo, pusryčių, Šv. Tėvas susitiko su 23 provoslavų, musulmonų, žydų, evangelikų ir religijų atstovais nuniciatuose. Po šio trumpo pokalbio Popiežius aplankė miškingose Antakalnio kalvose nusidriekusius kapus. Šv. Tėvo rüpestingas, atidus žvilgsnis slydo per nuo lietaus apsunkusias eglių šakas, žylinčias gėles, o ypatingai per apsamanojusius ir dar visai naujus kryžius. Štai kodėl Popiežius savo maldoje, kurią jis skyré dėl Lietuvos laisvės žuvusiems 1991 m. sausio 13-ąją prie televizijos bokšto, nukankintiems Medininkuose ir visiems didvyriams ir aukoms, minėjo kryžius:

"O kad Tavojo Kryžiaus švesa, Viešpatie, nušvestu ir iprasmintu visus kryžius! Žvelgdamas į juos, kiekvienas Lietuvos sūnus teprisimena, jog žmogus - jo paties ir visų brolių - orumas remiasi į Tave, miręs ir prisikélés Kristau, laiko ir istorijos viešpatie, kiekvienos žmogiškos būties pradžia ir pabaiga. Amen!"

Lietus nesutrukė tūkstančiams žmonių susirinkti į Vingio parką, kur Šv. Tėvas aukojo mišias. Popiežiaus pamokslo miritis: "Kas gimė iš Dvasios, yra Dvasia" (Jn 3,6). Šv. Tėvas pabrėžė tuos laikus, kai buvo stengiamasi iškieptyti materializmo dvasią, todėl Popiežius ragino: "Šiandien kartu su atgautaja laisve nauju įkarščiu reikia skelbti Kristaus apie žmogaus "širdį" pasakyti žodžius: "Kas gimė iš Dvasios, yra Dvasia".

Savo pamokslo pabaigoje Šv. Tėvas pasakė: "Krikštu priartėjame prie Kristaus, - prie žmonių ir tautų

PREZ. A. BRAZAUSKAS JUNGtinėse TAUTOSE

Lietuvos Prezidentas Algirdas Brazauskas rugsėjo 29 d. perskaite kalbą Jungtinių Tautų Generalinės asamblėjos 48 sesijoje New Yorke. "Mes kreipiamės į Jungtinės Tautas prašydami paramos, ginant mažųjų valstybių interesus", — sakė Lietuvos vadovas. Jungtinių Tautų asamblėjos dalyviai buvo informuoti, kad Lietuva kuria demokratinę, pilietinę visuomenę, pagrįstą teisės viršenybe, kur žmonės neskirstomi, priklausomai nuo jų tautybės, religijos ir politinių įsitikinimų.

"Mūsų šalyje nėra įtampos tarp lietuvių ir nacionalinių mažumų. Reformuojame ir stabilizuojame Lietuvos ekonomiką, ieškome būdų, kaip garantuoti bent minimalias socialines garantijas", — kalbėjo Lietuvos Prezidentas. Jis pažymėjo, kad Lietuva, kaip ir kitos valstybės, ieško savo vietas naujajame Europos žemėlapyje.

"Mes savo žvilgsnį kreipiame į glaudesnį Baltijos jūros regiono

valstybių bendradarbiavimą. Svarbus tokio bendradarbiavimo ir Lietuvos santykijų su Rusija aspektas — mūsų ryšiai su Kaliningrado sritimi". Buvo pabrėžta, kad Lietuvos, kaip ir kitų regiono valstybių, interesas yra laipsniškas šios srities demilitarizavimas, vystantis joje laisvos prekybos zonai, didėjant tarptautinių organizacijų, ypač Europos Bendrijos, įtakai.

A. Brazausko nuomone, ateityje Baltijos jūros pakrantės turėtų būti laisvos nuo ginklų. Todėl jau dabar reikėtų imtis pasitikėjimą ir saugumą didinančių priemonių.

Primindamas, kad trumpiausias kelias iš Paryžiaus, Berlyno, Varšuvos į Maskvą ėjo ir eina per Lietuvą, Lietuvos vadovas accentavo, jog ilgus dešimtmečius juo per mūsų žemę riedėjo karo vežimai, puolančios ir besitraudien mes norime, kad per mūsų teritoriją riedėtų prekių srautai. Mes tikimės ir dirbamė tam, kad

mūsų sudėtinga geopolitinė padėtis naujoje, antagonistinių ideologijų nebedraskomoje Europoje taptų naujų galimybų, naudos ir gerovės šaltiniu", — kalbėjo A. Brazauskas.

Dékodamas visoms — didelėms ir mažoms — valstybėms, parėmuisiems teisėtą Lietuvos siekį — išvesti Rusijos kariuomenę, Lietuvos Prezidentas priminė, kad svetima kariuomenė dar yra Latvijoje ir Estijoje. Buvo išsakyta viltis, kad padendant Jungtinėms Tautoms, pavys išspręsti šią tarptautinę problemą ir tuo pačiu sutvirtinti stabilumą regione.

Lietuvos vadovas sakė remiąs prieš metus Jungtinėse Tautose išsakytą idėją — Saugumo tarybą papildyti naujais nuolatiniais nariais. "Lietuva ne tik remia tai- kos palaikymo operacijas, bet ir ir pasiruošusi jose dalyvauti, tap- ti karinius dalinius teikiančia šali". — kalbėjo A. Brazauskas.

istorijoje ręsto pastato kertinio akmens. Statykime ant Jo visą mūsų ateiti. Būkime gyvieji akmenys tos Sandoros, kurią mūsų protėviai sudarė su Dievu. Amen!"

Popiežius Vingio parke sukalbėjo "Viešpaties Angelo" maldą.

Po pietų Popiežius susitiko Vilniaus universitete su mokslo ir kultūros veikėjais. Čia Popiežius savo kalboje apžvelgė kovingojo ateizmo ir marksizmo žalą žmogiškai dvasiai. Šv. Tėvas pabrėžė intelektualų vaidmenį visuomenėje:

"Dabarties įvykiai verčia mus teisėtai galvoti, jog gyvename epochinę pasaulio istorijos lūžio akmirką. Šiuo sunkiu keliu į ateiti, kurios niekas šiandien negali nuspėti ar nubrėžti jos ribų, tikrai lemiamą reikšmę turi intelektualų vaidmuo. Ji reikia iš naujo pabrėžti, ypač nūnai, kai žlugusios ideologijos sugriovė pasitikėjimą, o filosofinė mintis, ko gero, pakrypusi į spepticizmą ir pavojingą pragmatizmą".

Rugsėjo 8-ąjį Vilniaus aerouoste nuskambėjo Popiežiaus atsisveikinimo kalba. Paskutinieji žodžiai, ištarti Lietuvos žemėje, skambėjo ypatingai jautriai ir prasmingai:

"Lietuva gerai žino, ką reiškia tvarkyti žmogaus gyvenimą be Dievo. Liūdną praeities patirtį visi puikiai mena. Brangūs Broliai ir Sesės, reikia atverti duris kitiems akiračiams. Šiam tikslui Bažnyčia siūlo remties Evangelija, kuri yra šviesa, apšviečianti žmogaus vertą visuomeninės pažangos kelią. Šiam kelyje kiekvienas asmuo pripažistamas kaip gyvojo Dievo paveikslas. Dėka šios šviesos ir lietuvių sugebės kurti gėrį, vienintį ir taikiai gyventi. Šiuos mano nuoširdžiausius linkėjimus telydi mano Palaiminimas".

Atsisveikindamas Popiežius ižiebė Lietuvai viltį, kuri nuo sunkaus kasdieninio gyvenimo jau buvo pradėjusi gesti. Šv. Tėvas nurodė ir kelią, kuriuo einant ta viltis taps gyvenimu.

- During the 6th month the baby responds to light and sound, can hear his mother's heartbeat and recognizes her voice.
- By the 7th month consciousness exists and the unborn baby begins to retain memories.
