A big campaign to organize the workers' children of the whole country in support of the national conference of children to be held at Chicago on July 4th has been started by the Young Pioneers of America.

The conference will be held at the same time as the convention of the unemployed workers in Chicago, called by the Trade Union Unity League.

The main slogans of the conference of children will be the fight against the rotten conditions that we have to face, the fight against unemployment, and to demand freedom for Harry Eisman, the 15 year old Pioneer who is now serving a sentence of over 5 years in jail because he fought with the workers against unemployment.

At the conference, the demand will be raised for free food, free fare, and free clothing for the children of the unemployed workers. The conference will demand that the bosses and their government supply the money for this.

The whole Pioneer movement has been set in motion to rally the workers' children in support of the conference. The Pioneers are carrying the fight for the workers' and farmers' children right into the schools, and are raising there the demand for free food and clothing.

Conferences of child delegates from classrooms are being called by the Pioneers, in order to elect school delegates to the national conference. Workers' children in the schools and factories are called upon to elect their delegates to this meet.

All workers' and farmers' children should support this conference!

Needle Trades Workers Union Holds National Convention

The 2nd National Convention of the Needle Trades Workers Industrial Union opened in New York City on June 6th. Thousands of needle workers attended a mass meeting in New Star Casino to open the convention.

Over 400 cloakmakers, dressmakers, furriers, were delegates to this convention, representing the needle trades workers of many cities. Young workers, women, and Negro workers were among the delegates.

This convention is not like the conventions of the fakers' unions, like the International Ladies Garment Workers "Union," or the Amalgamated Clothing Workers. They are a bunch of fakers who always betray the workers.

This convention was made up of workers who discussed the conditions in the industry, and laid plans to organize all the workers to fight against the bosses and against their agents, the "socialists" and labor fak-

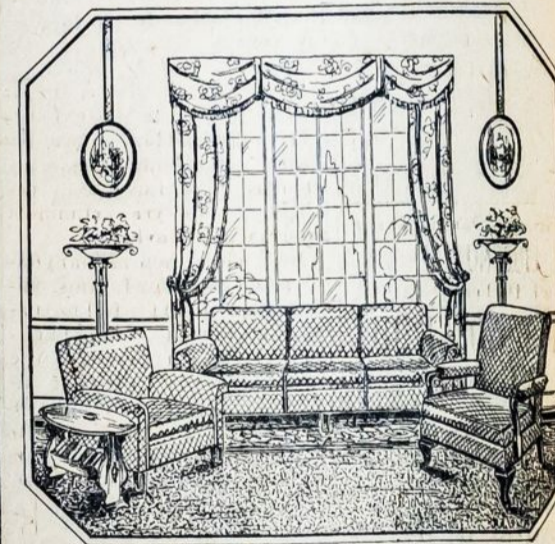
