LITHUANIANS MEET LITHUANIANS IN GERMANY

The following are excerpts from two letters written by American-Lithuanian soldiers from Germany. The first one comes from Pfc. V. B. Ziaukas of St. Casimir's Church, Pittsburgh; the second, from Sgt. S. A. Miller of St. Andrew's Church, New Britain, Conn.

In one of the towns I passed through I met a bunch of Lithuanian people. It so happened that my clothes were dirty; and, as I saw this lady washing clothes across the street, I borrowed some others and took mine over to have them cleaned. In my broken German, I tried to tell this lady what I wanted, but she told me that she couldn't understand because she was a Lithuanian.

I've met some of our Lithuanian speaking people out here. It was quite a surprise. I've seen many laborers here in Germany, all nationalities. This day I heard two little boys; as they passed me I listened and couldn't believe my ears. They were speaking Lithuanian. I asked them in Lithuanian 'How are you?' Their eyes lit up and they smiled from ear to ear to hear Lithuanian from an American soldier.

LONDON.—It was learned from the most authoritative Russian circles in London that the Kremlin is seriously concerned over the official Anglo-American firmness against Soviet unilateral action in Europe, and the intense wave of critical reaction in Britain and the United States.

freedom of movement for American newspapermen will be denied until Sovietization of these areas is completed. The biggest current "bogey" facing the Russians is the formation of an anti-Communist Latin bloc in Europe, spearheaded by French Catholics.

Baltic States Violated—Congressman Reed

Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania were independent republics, created in 1918, and recognized as such by Russia, who also signed non-aggression pacts with each of them. They were occupied by Russia in 1940, and shortly afterwards pretended plebiscites, under Russian auspices, were held in each of them, under which they were incorporated into the Soviet Union.
